The Bn enbussed at Bivouac free and in R.M.T. proced-eded in column of route formation in the following order to
Bde S.P. two miles away.:- A - B - H.Q. & Bn HQ - D - C Coys respectively, with B. Echelon in rear.

1400 hrs: Having joined the Bde and attached troops the convoyatin desert formation headed straight out into the desert mome on a compass bearing true of 290 degrees. Space between vehicles from front rear and side 200 yards, and with a protective screen of Bren Carriers on the outer perimeters the Bde resembled an ocean going convoy. This formation remained unbroken until a defiled along a barrel track forced the convoy to close in to 20 yards did distance between vehicles and the ten or so lanes of tot were red-uced to fit into the narrow floor of the valley.

The going had been good despite the flinty surface of rock, and in places the soft sand. Desert formation was once more resumed resumed when the valley was negotiated, and later in the afternoon the Back shook out into their respective Bivouac Areas.

The Bn halted at 1930 hrs and just at "last light" close formation was completed the Bn facing more or less WEST with Bren Carriers on the outer aspects of the formation.

Distance travelled this afternoon was approx 25 miles.

By 0600 hrs the Bn was ready to move, just after "first light"

0645 With the Bde reformed into desert formation the convoy continued its march on a line of 285 degrees true bearing.

A little later this course was altered as we gradually swung was to mote to the NORTH and with the FUCA Landing ground far over to our right in the distance a halt was called for lunch.

-after lunch in column of route formation the convoy compleeted its move to the New Div area, having linked up with the Matruh Road at about the 63 Km Peg.

In the early afternoon the Bn reached its Bivuose area this side and fery nearly on the Baqqush airodrome at the 50 km peg.
